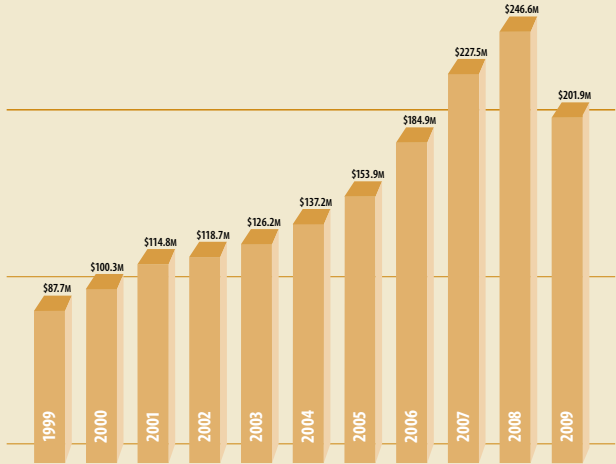

INCOME AND EXPENSES 2008–09

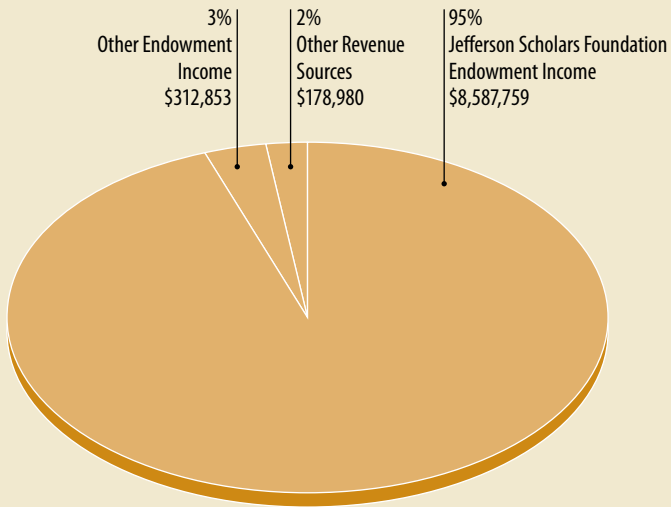
GROWTH OF ENDOWMENT PORTFOLIO

(Dollars In Millions – Through May 31, 2009)



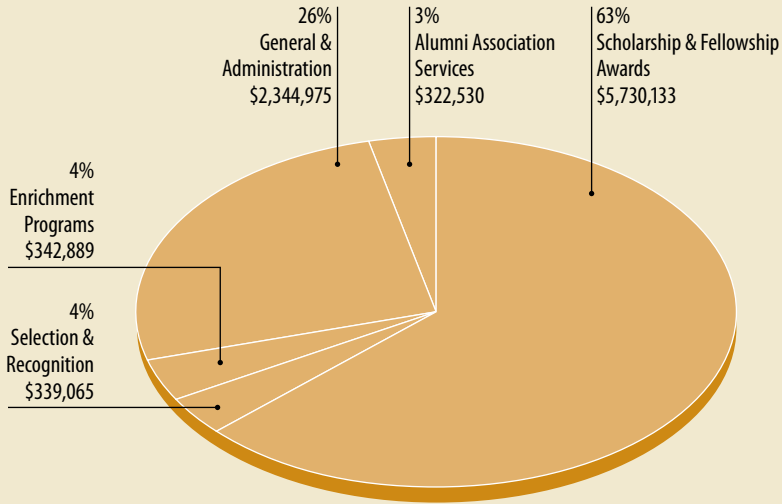
SOURCES OF INCOME

Total \$9,079,592



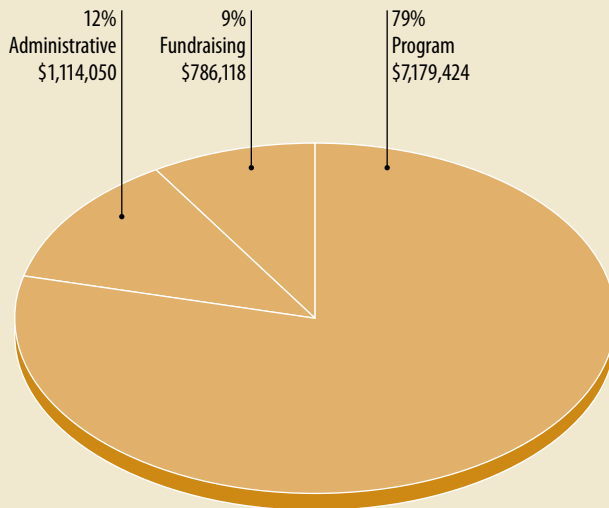
EXPENSE BREAKDOWN
